Are You Talking to Me?

A Toronto-based artist, Lake is known for her work as a photographer, performance artist and video producer. Using a range of media, she explores topics including identity, beauty, gender and aging. She is a pioneering feminist artist and political activist. She is a member of the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts and recipient of the Governor General's Award in Visual and Media Arts, and the Scotiabank Photography Award.



Thursday October 21—Dorothy Caldwell

Exploration of the Unfamiliar

"My textile work is a map of land and memory. I am interested in the landmarks that give a sense of place and how humans mark and visualize the land."

From her studio in Hastings, Ontario, Caldwell maintains an active international exhibition and teaching schedule. Her travel and research in India, Japan, and Australia has influenced her work both as sources of dyeing and stitching practices and as places where textile artists share her beliefs in the integration of historical work in contemporary contexts. She has executed major architectural commissions, and her work is in many permanent collections in Canada and abroad.




Thursday November 18—David Kaye

My Gallery Story

"My presentation will illustrate an overview of the many artists that I have had the pleasure to work with. My original interest was in exhibiting object-based work in a variety of media, which then veered into showing some painting. I was a practicing artist in textiles before I became caught up in the gallery world, and that influenced the work I liked to exhibit."

Kaye graduated from the Ontario College of Art and was awarded a Chalmers Scholarship and the Lieutenant-Governor's Medal. After working in several Toronto galleries and pursuing his own art practice, he then opened the DAVID KAYE GALLERY in 2006. Following the gallery's 2018 closing, he has continued promoting artists' work on his website DAVID KAYE PROJECTS.
